Expanding Our Reach: Working with City Administration

City Council made a decision in March to explore a partnership with Connect Wetaskiwin to organize local engagement sessions aimed at understanding community engagement better. In June, our proposal was approved, leading to the hosting of three focus group engagement sessions. Our first focus group was with associations, followed by local interagencies, then Council & Administration. All sessions have been constructive, productive and fun and have focused on uncovering the genuine needs of locals to enhance engagement while exploring the role of trust in our interactions. We have two more upcoming sessions planned: one to gather insights from Indigenous residents and another to listen to senior citizens' perspectives. For the past year, we've been gathering every second Thursday of the month from **6-7pm** at the **Wetaskiwin District Heritage Museum on 50th Ave**. Recently, we've added themed discussions, allowing us to hear not only residents' ideas and concerns but also insights from content experts who provide valuable information and guidance. We've had the opportunity to learn from the city's Environmental Services and Public Works department about local issues, as well as from the RCMP, By-law, and Redline Street Society regarding street racing in our area. As a result of these sessions, two action groups have emerged: one exploring the feasibility of installing city-wide security cameras and another assisting public works in creating new interpretive signs for By-The-Lake-Park.
